From the Pastor...

July/August 2020

Dear MPC Family,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I hope you are able to join us this Sunday, July 5th at 10:30AM for a very special worship service on Facebook Live. We will be joining together for worship with our brothers and sisters from the First Presbyterian Church of Skagway, Alaska, with whom we have partnered in mission for the past decade. Pastor Ryan Mandeville and I will be sharing God's Word, we'll have music from both communities, and also an opportunity to share in Communion together. Typically, this would be the week MPC would be sending a team of adults and teenagers to serve the community there. We lament that we were unable to do so this year due to the pandemic, but we also rejoice that online worship provides us an opportunity to come together as one body of Christ.

Earlier in June, I sent out a video update that outlined some recent decisions made by MPC leadership related to our reopening process. On June 23rd, our Session voted to continue with online worship only at least through Sunday, August 30th. Though Multnomah County is currently in Phase 1 (allowing for local gatherings of 25 or less), our COVID-19 Response team recommended to Session that we continue to worship online at least through the summer. The Response Team (Roy Magnusson, Davina Soumokil, Ray McKean, Barb Jones, Dennis Zerba, and myself) will continue to meet together this summer to determine how MPC can best implement policies and procedures to keep our community safe. The reopening process is incredibly complex, and we are taking a cautious approach for the love of our church family, our neighborhood, and our city.

This summer, our leadership is taking steps to open our facility for daily staff operations, as well as small groups gatherings of 15 or less. We have created a Facility Occupancy and Social Distancing Policy that provides guidance for small gatherings at MPC. These guidelines include social distancing, the wearing of face coverings, locations of meetings, and sanitizing surfaces. This policy will likely go into effect sometime in July, and when the time comes, we will share the policy with you in its entirety, so that we all have a clear understanding of how the church will operate this summer.

Church, I share all of these things with you with an incredibly heavy heart. I've spoken with many of you about the challenges of being the church from a distance. It's not easy. But I also share these things with you from a place of hope, for we have a hope in Jesus that is firm and unshakable. There is so much we can't see right now and so much we don't know, but we do know this: "he who began a good work in [us] will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

Happy Summer, MPC! The Mission Committee met the third week of June and voted to donate \$500 to Grace Kuto's organization Harambee Center for support and development in Chwele, Kenya. Kenya is currently facing three crises: the Covid-19 pandemic, catastrophic flooding, and the worst locust swarms in 70 years, which are decimating crops. We pray that God will use this money to make a difference to those affected.

The Mission Committee has also now donated a total of \$900 towards for rent and utility assistance for the residents of Stephen's Creek, which will be distributed by the Deacons on an as-needed basis. After speaking with the director at Stephen's Creek, we felt this would be the best way to help residents there who are currently struggling to pay their bills.



Session Update


At the May Session meeting (held via Zoom), Session:

- Authorized Danny to officiate communion virtually, during the 10:30 worship on Facebook Live until live-person gatherings resume, with parishioners providing their own elements in their own homes during the live streaming broadcast.
- Added our congregation, Multnomah Presbyterian Church, to "A Statement of Unity Regarding the Reopening of Churches in Oregon."
- Established a COVID-19 Response Team for MPC consisting of Danny Peters, Roy Magnusson, Davina Soumokil, Ray McKean, Denis Zerba, and Barb Jones, and authorized the team to begin meeting, so they may recommend to Session how to safely and responsibly return to in-person gatherings and worship services.
- Approved sending \$2500 to the First Presbyterian Church of Skagway (from designated fund #352) to be used as they see fit to support the community.
- Adopted MPC Safety Policies and Procedures for Youth and Children effective May 27, 2020.

At the June meeting, held via Zoom, Session passed the following motions:

- Authorized Pastor Danny Peters to co-officiate communion virtually with Pastor Ryan Mandeville of Skagway, Alaska, during 10:30 worship on Facebook Live on July 5, 2020, with parishioners providing the own elements in their own homes during the live stream broadcast. MPC and First Pres. of Skagway will worship together, virtually, on July 5.
- Adopted the Facility Occupancy and Social Distancing Policy, effective when Phase 2 begins in Multnomah County and accepted the recommendations from the COVID-19 Response Team to continue Live Stream Worship only (no in-person worship) through August 30, 2020, and to comply with Multnomah County requirements for Phase 1 openings.
- Approved a donation of \$500 from Line Item 1326 (World Vision) to Chwele Mission for a special fundraiser in response to ongoing challenges in Kenya due to COVID-19/flooding/locusts.
